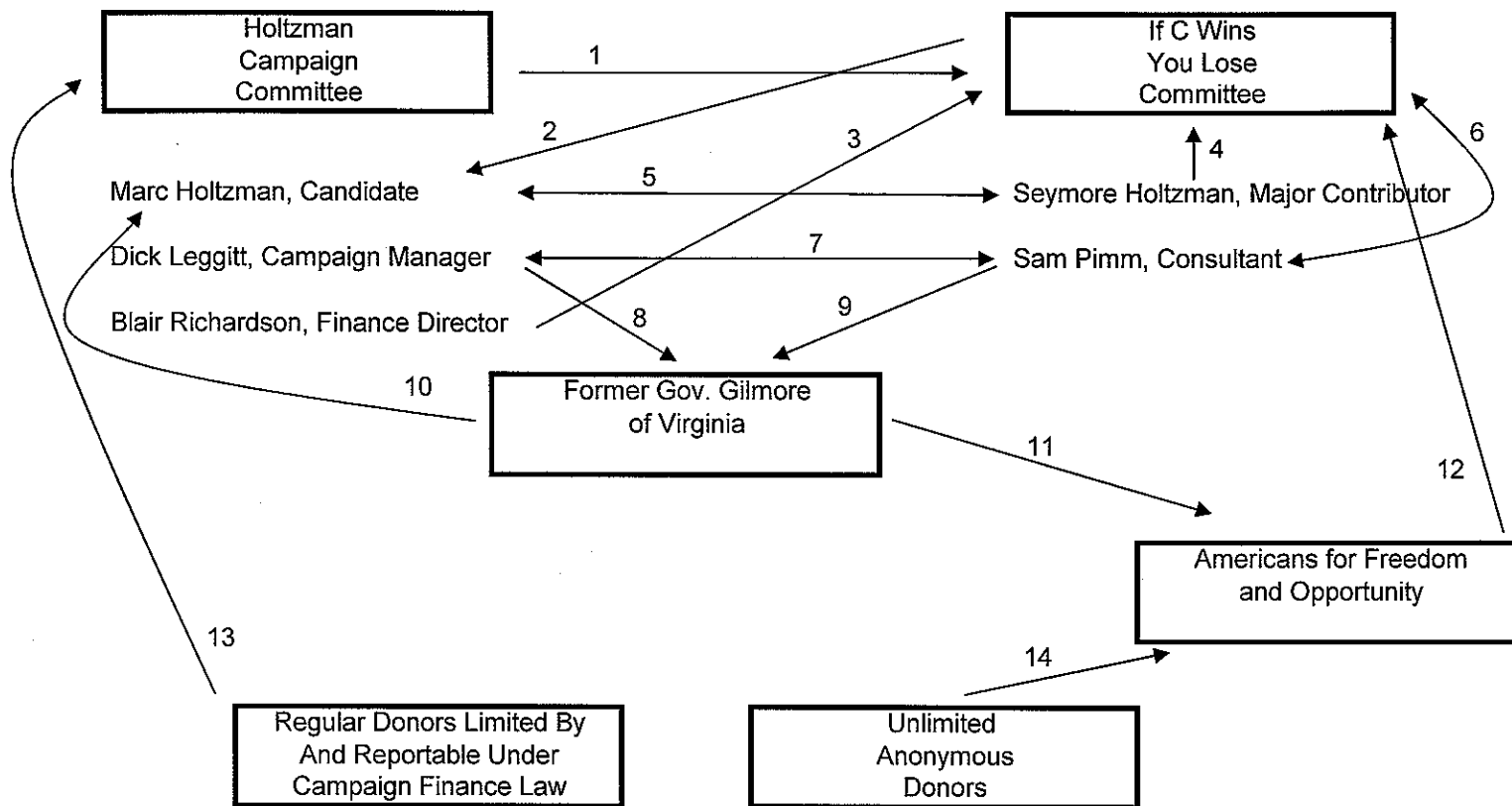


Oh what a tangled web we weave.....



1. The Holtzman campaign adopts the defeat of Ref. C as a major platform strategy.
2. The "If C Wins You Lose Committee" is established and features Holtzman in TV ads
3. Blair Richardson, the Holtzman campaign finance director, contributes \$50,000 to the "If C Wins You Lose Committee"
4. A company controlled by Seymour Holtzman, Mark's father, contributes \$100,000 to the "If C Wins You Lose Committee"
5. Seymour Holtzman is Mark Holtzman's father.
6. Sam Pimm was the highest compensated person in the "If C Wins You Lose Committee" in September 2005
7. Dick Leggitt, Holtzman's campaign manager, and Sam Pimm, from the "If C Wins You Lose Committee" have a long history. Leggitt hired Pimm in April 2004 to be his deputy campaign manager when Leggitt was campaign manager in the West Virginia gubernatorial race in 2004. They worked together running the West Virginia race all last year.
8. Dick Leggitt was former Governor Gilmore's campaign manager in Virginia.
9. Leggit and Pimm sponsored Gilmore's visit to campaign on behalf of their candidate in West Virginia in 2004.
10. Governor Gilmore campaigns for Holtzman in Colorado
11. Governor Gilmore founded the Americans for Freedom and Opportunity organization
12. Americans for Freedom and Opportunity contributes \$140,000 to the "If C Wins You Lose Committee"
13. Regular donors to campaign committees are limited and reportable under campaign finance law
14. Donors to certain types of organizations are unlimited and anonymous
